Spring is upon us!!

With spring upon us a friendly reminder about upkeep of yards, open burning and building permits.

Now that the snow has melted and grass and weeds will start growing, grass and weeds are to be cut periodically and should never be greater than eight (8) inches. Also please try to not blow your lawn clippings into the street, this is not a code violation, but a courtesy to try and keep our streets looking nice.

Open burning is allowed within the city limits. When burning within city limits it must be conducted in compliance with rules and limitations established by the State Department of Natural Resources.

Building permits are required for any structure being built, brought in, or added to within the City of Plymouth. Contact Ric Vermedal for building permits and applications.


