The 2016 Plymouth City Dog Tags will be sold during the month of January at the Plymouth City Hall on **Monday-Thursday 8am—4pm**

Owners of dogs **four (4) months of age or older by January 1, 2017**

MUST purchase a city dog tag. A current rabies vaccination certificate must be presented before a dog tag may be purchased.

Dogs under the age of four months **MUST** obtain a city dog tag within 30 days after becoming four months of age. Anyone obtaining a dog after January is also required to purchase a dog tag within 30 days.

The fee for dog tags purchased during the month of January is \$5.00 per tag. A \$2.00 per month delinquent penalty will be charged on all tags purchased **after** January 31st, 2017.

Don't forget to turn your clocks ahead 1 hour on March 12th as Daylight Savings Time begins. Only a few more months of short days and long nights then spring will be upon us.
