## A Reminder of City Ordinance

### **No vehicles on street during snow removal**

As a friendly reminder as we prepare for winter, no person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or City-owned off-street parking area during snow removal operations unless the snow has been removed or plowed from said street, alley or parking area and the snow has ceased to fall. It is also unlawful for any person to throw, push, or place or cause to be thrown, pushed or placed, any ice or snow from private property, sidewalks, or driveways onto the traveled way of a street or alley so as to impede the passage of vehicles upon the street or alley or to create a hazardous condition therein.

It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. If a property owner does not remove snow, ice, or accumulations within a reasonable time, the City maybe do so and assess the cost against the property owner for collection in the same manner as a

property tax.
